
'Nearly Lear'

Lockington Village Improvement Group (LVIG)

The principal changes include

On 25th November a large congregation bade farewell to Irene, a most beloved and highly regarded member of our village community.

She and Brian arrived here in 1984. Having been involved with helping children in a nursery she continued

with her life-long interest in the "Save the Children" organisation, hosting many fund raising events in their home at "Four Shilling Piece" in Church Lane. (Yes, there was such coin and they had one.) Irene became a prison visitor at Hull and York and also volunteered at the Citizen's Advice Bureau in Driffield, helping people with serious problems, but her main activity was helping Brian in his new job (he was head hunted as a crop adviser for a group of local farmers) as his business company secretary.

They both became very active in village church life, Brian having

started the tradition of outdoor village carol singing with Irene as an alto and himself as the tenor leader. Originally the small group toured the village on an illuminated farm wagon pulled by Sam Walton's Fendt tractor:- a wondrous sight! This was followed by Irene-made pizzas at "chez Beeney".

Irene joined the Parochial Church Council and was instrumental in helping many newcomers to the village as well as being the Electoral Roll Officer. When Brian became Church Warden, Irene was always at his side helping with the onerous work that such a role requires. She was also active in the Yorkshire Countrywomen's regular meetings.

Having raised three children and looked after her ailing parents, family concerns were her top priority especially with the arrival of grand-daughter Milly. Long will she be remembered as a caring and devoted wife, mother, grandmother and friend to all who was never heard to speak ill of anyone.
