The Parish Council are very grateful to the many residents who attended the Amen Field meeting and voiced their concerns regarding this project. The Parish Council also want to thank the two representatives from ERYC, Mr David Siddle (Rural Housing Enabler), and Mrs Nuala Taylor (Principal Asset Officer) who made a presentation on Affordable Housing.

After an intensive question and answering session, ERYC have agreed to maintain dialogue with the Parish Council on the progress of this project.

The Parish Council have also asked St Mary's PCC if they could send a representative to the next Parish Council meeting on the 17th of April, to ensure we all have the same understanding of the potential development at Amen Field (Affordable Housing).
