


Hall at any event or at Thursday Coffee and Post Office morning. We'll continue to do this in future, so Poppies will be available in the village next year.






afternoon out for the ceremony with a sparkling afternoon tea. *Well done, lain!*

No admission charge but donations are welcome. Magazines, books etc available to purchase, proceeds going to Church Roof



Lockington – Village Flood Wardens (VFW)

The persons listed below have volunteered to act as "Volunteer Flood Wardens".

Please note that at times of excessive rainfall and possible flood risk, it is not possible to know in advance which wardens will be at home, at work or otherwise out of the village. For this reason, we do not have a hierarchical structure. The wardens have volunteered to take a lead in the part of the village where they live. This includes:

- Helping anybody requiring assistance. Please call those nearest to you as per the attached list.
- Clearing drains and obstacles that might block water getting into the various drainage systems.
- Advising Drivers and other road users if the road is flooded and a risk to both them and surrounding properties.
- Requesting drivers to take an alternative route especially if the wash from a vehicle might cause damage to property or persons.

Other duties undertaken by the VFWs have included for example clearing weed from the Beck and other watercourse and providing invaluable advice to the Parish council which has led to some significant improvements. There is an ongoing dialogue between the LPC, the ERYC Highways Dept and the Environment Agency on further improvements. VFWs are kept informed of any developments through a WhatsApp group and e mail.
