paper. Rev Walter Blackett, MA  
was the incumbent from 1959 to  
1966.

Anthony Steele was Church-  
warden for many years. He and  
Sylvia Steele lived in the Old  
Rectory, now Lockington House.  
He was an architect who in 1951  
sold off the land in Church Lane  
for building houses which he  
designed and his wife chose the  
house names.

George Clark lived in 59 Thorpe  
and was verger for many years.  
The roles of People's Warden  
and Vicar's Warden are not  
now in common use. We just  
have two Wardens, Andrea  
Parr and Sam Walton.  
Fortunately our church  
finances are now in better  
shape!

## Profitable Year for Lockington Church

Last year Lockington Parish Church had only  
£2 in the bank. This year they had £152 and  
a few shillings over, the Vicar told members  
at the annual meeting of the Parochial  
Church Council held at Lockington.

There were about 20 people present.

The Vicar, Rev W Blackett, said that Mr and  
Mrs Steele had offered their garden for a  
garden fete, which it is hoped will be held  
some time in July, and the proceeds would be  
for church funds.

He thanked Mr G Clark for his work as  
verger and Mrs L Watson for her duties as  
organist.

Mr R Cole was elected as people's warden,  
Mr J Wilson was elected vicar's warden and  
Mrs T Wilson as secretary of the church  
council.



### Harry Ellerker

These photographs, dated 1983, have  
recently been discovered by Sam Walton.  
Harry Ellerker lived at 70 Thorpe and was  
well known in the village for his  
enthusiastic use of a steam roller and  
other mechanical equipment such as a  
thrashing machine. As the headmaster  
of our school, Malcolm Grice, appears on  
the extreme left it would seem that this  
was some sort of school work party  
involving buckets. His daughter, Debbie,  
is front row centre in white. Why the  
event required a steam roller is unclear!

The name Ellerker lives on, as a G Ellerker  
carved his name on the organ case,  
presumably on duty as a bored organ  
blower in the days before the church had  
electricity.

### Facebook Photo

This fine photograph of  
Front Street with School  
Farm was found on  
Facebook by Joy Moate, a  
Lockington resident now  
living in Roos. In the  
distance the Primitive  
Methodist Chapel can be  
seen. This was built in  
1913. The single storey  
cottages appear to be  
thatched and possibly  
built of chalk blocks with brick chimneys. Note that the road is crushed chalk. The  
roads were not tarred until about 1930.
