

Never speaking ill of anyone, she was much loved and hugely respected by all who knew her.

It will be a long time before the village gets to know another like her. May she rest in peace with her beloved Eric in our churchyard.



The Parish Council wishes to update the Parish on progress with the Village Green.

The Parish of Lockington is now the legal owner of the Village Green, ensuring a green space at the centre of the village for perpetuity. A permanent access into the green has been created and is now complete, however, for safety reasons the gates remain locked shut until the green is made safe and developed.

The results of the survey taken in 2020 and an Indicative Plan was published in Issue 147 of the Lockington Gazette. The forward plan is to discuss this at an open meeting on Tuesday 15th of October 2024 at 7pm in the Village Hall.
