

Aurora over Lockington

Were you lucky enough to see a beautiful, colourful display of Aurora Borealis recently?

So, what is an aurora? The aurora light displays are caused by magnetic storms on the Sun that throw off charged particles towards Earth which interact with our atmosphere, producing colourful light effects 70 - 300 miles up.

During a geomagnetic storm, an auroral oval can expand, brighten and move south from the polar regions. The Sun's 11-year magnetic cycle reaches a peak this year, but don't despair. There is still a good chance of more displays to come.

So, what do you see? Look to the north when it is completely dark, clear skies, no moonshine, no streetlights or light pollution.

Up Kilnwick hill is a good spot. Colours in the sky may start as a whitish glow, then greens, reds, blues. It may only last few minutes with blocks of colour, arcs, swirling bands, often repeating during the night. Incidentally your phone camera will always show more colour than your eyes.
